SUPPORT HB 1834/SB 1247

Power Plant Transparency and Community Preparation Act Senator Deeds, Delegate Subramanyam

Reasons to support House Bill 1834/Senate Bill 1247

- 1. The Virginia Clean Economy Act (VCEA) prohibits carbon emissions from any in-state power plants larger than 25 megawatts beginning in 2050.
- 2. Power plants are significant sources of tax revenue and jobs for the localities in which they are located. For example, the Virginia Cities Hybrid Energy Center (VCHEC) accounts for 20% of Wise County's tax revenue.
- 3. Power plants are likely to close before the dates required by the VCEA in order to meet carbon reduction requirements and/or due to market forces. For example, the Chesterfield coal power plant will close in 2021 (the VCEA requires it to close by 2024), and VCHEC may close within 3-5 years (the VCEA requires it to close by 2045).
- 4. The public is only aware of the early closure of the VCHEC plant because of financial information revealed by the Attorney General in a State Corporation Commission case. This information should be public for all power plants.

Overview

- 1. Requires owners of carbon-emitting electrical facilities ≥80 megawatts to notify impacted communities and relevant state agencies of power plant closures and work with local governments to provide public hearings.
 - The notice must include information regarding worker transition assistance and environmental clean-up.
 - Notice must be provided within 30 days of a decision to close, and public hearings must take place within 6 months.
- 2. Requires the Department of Energy to maintain a website of carbonemitting power plants with announced, required, or estimated closures, and environmental permits.
- 3. Requires investor-owned utilities' periodic integrated resource plan filings to include facility retirement studies, which must be provided to impacted communities and relevant state agencies.
