Topic: Data Centers Siting Bill Patron: Delegate Josh Thomas

OVERVIEW:

This bill would prohibit the construction of a data center within $\frac{1}{2}$ mile of a national park, state park, or historically significant site.

Reasons to support:

- The proliferation of data centers in Virginia has spread from traditional industrial zones to numerous areas directly adjacent to national parks, state parks, and other historic resources.
- Data centers are a heavy industrial use, which is inherently incompatible with parks and historic resources.
- This bill provides a reasonable buffer of one-half mile from Virginia's most treasured places and the heavy industrial development of data centers.
