

# SUPPORT HB153/SB130

Topic: Data Center Transparency

Bill Patron: Delegate Josh Thomas and Senator Adam Ebbin

## OVERVIEW:

House Bill 153 and Senate Bill 130 seek to address certain transparency and information concerns around high-energy use facilities (over 100MW), mainly large data centers. The bill would require data center developers to provide localities with a site assessment examining their noise impact on nearby residential areas and schools. The bill would also clarify existing code ensure that if localities want to consider impacts on water, agriculture, parks, historic sites, and forests they have the authority to require this information. The bill also requires the disclosure of needed new electric utility infrastructure, like transmission lines and substations, that would be constructed to support the project within that locality.

## REASONS TO SUPPORT:

- JLARC's 2024 Data Center Report identified that numerous localities are uncertain if they are allowed to consider impacts to resources beyond the immediate site of projects before them, such as regional water supply, the electric grid, and other resources. This bill seeks to solve that problem.
- Moreover, JLARC's report, along with lived community experiences around Virginia, indicates the clear need for deeper and more meaningful consideration of noise impacts on communities, as well as impacts on historic sites, forests and other environmental resources.
- Overall, this bill supports one of the four pillars of data center reform – increased transparency around the industry. Combined with the other three bills, localities will be better equipped to make responsible decisions, and the state will be in a better position to ensure the data center industry is operating in harmony with communities and the environment.
